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New Foundation Enrolment Information for 2025

The Department of Education has released a new statewide timeline for enrolling in Foundation (Prep) for the 2025 school year. If you have a child starting primary school in 2025, it's time to enrol.

Enrolment application forms are now available at Dandenong South Primary School.

Make sure to complete and submit your enrolment application by **Friday 26 July 2024.**

If you are enrolling the sibling of a student at our school for Foundation in 2025, and both children will be attending our school at the same time, your child is prioritised for a place at our school as per the department's Placement Policy. It is important to follow the statewide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation.

Between Monday 29th July and Friday 9th August 2024 School will provide parents and carers with written notification of Foundation enrolment outcomes. If parents receive the confirmation of enrolment, they must collect the enrolment forms from the school.

By Friday 23rd August 2024, parents and carers sent a letter of offer must return the completed enrolment forms to indicate acceptance of their child's enrolment offer.

Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

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Grade1 News

The Grade One students and teachers have had a wonderful start to Term Two! As part of their learning, students have been exploring the topic of history and have been learning about the significance of ANZAC Day. Through viewing educational videos, reading, and listening to factual texts and stories, as well as engaging in discussions, students have deepened their understanding of the importance of this day.

In Mathematics, students have been learning to solve addition and subtraction problems using a range of strategies. Students have also been practising their counting skills by completing fluency activities and playing counting games.

As part of their daily reading sessions, students are continuing to learn strategies to help them decode and comprehend texts. In Writing, the focus has been on students learning to write correctly structured sentences using capital letters and full stops. They have been given opportunities to write about a range of topics and personal experiences.


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



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Grade5/6 News























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Specialist : Indonesian

Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

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
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Supporting School Learning at Home

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

Primary School · Essential Topics for Dads







Top Tips for Dads

- · Read with your child from an early age and encourage an interest and enjoyment of reading. Show your children how you use reading each day and get them to join you, reading instructions, following road signs, reading news or reading a menu.
- Be willing to help with homework (even if that just means asking them questions). Discuss what they have to do and how they are going to do it, rather than doing it for them.
- · Let them be independent learners and be there to support, if they want to do the home learning themselves. This demonstrates self-management skills and should be encouraged and praised.
- · Don't put too much pressure on them - encourage them to be as good as they can be and help them plan how to improve.
- · If homework is causing stress or arguments, put it aside and take a break. Try again later and if there are still problems, contact the teacher to discuss solutions.

Wellbeing Check

We can all get frustrated, angry or upset at times. How we deal with these emotions is what's important. It is helpful to have some strategies to regulate your emotions so you don't overreact or regret your response. Did you know that just that act of stopping and recognising the emotion and naming it, can reduce the intensity of this feeling. This gives you the space to choose a helpful response.

Little Angler Kits

Thank you to the Victorian Fishing Authority for giving away the Little Angler kits to our Grade5/6 families. This is a great opportunity for primary school children to try fishing and to get outside and stay active, connecting with nature and enjoying time in the outdoors.

Key Safety Messages:

Going fishing is awesome and so much fun! When it comes to fishing, it's important to stay safe, especially around water!

Students can keep their fishing safe by:

- going with a friend;
- being careful with hooks and lures;
- looking behind before casting;
- handling fish carefully;
- being conscious of the dangers associated with water;
- protecting yourself against the elements (sunscreen, drinking water);
- letting someone know before you go; and washing your hands after handling lead sinkers, especially before eating or drinking.

Please note that fishing equipment is not for human consumption. If swallowed, hooks can cause serious harm and lead sinkers can be toxic. Young children and those with some disabilities including pica disorder are especially vulnerable and should be supervised whilst fishing. If a child does swallow a hook or lead sinker, seek medical assistance immediately - don't wait for it to pass.
